Police Objections to Witcombe Cider Festival

Dear Gordon

I am writing to you to notify Tewkesbury Borough Council of our formal objections to the proposed Witcombe Cider Festival at the new site situated at Pressmead Farm, Brockworth Lane, which is within the boundaries of Brockworth Parish Council.

The Witcombe Cider Festival event has been taken to a licensing review by the police on three previous occasions, and on the last occasion the organisers surrendered the licence prior to the hearing.

The position of the Gloucestershire Constabulary is that on the evidence of previous events, the organisers have shown that they are not equipped or capable to run this event safely. This is illustrated by the fact that significant elements of the conditions imposed by the Licensing Committee at Tewkesbury Borough Council were not complied with or were disregarded entirely. In essence the organisers and the site management practices were wholly ineffective and unsafe.

The police are objecting to this festival on the following grounds and relate to evidence gathered from the previous event in August 2017:-

Specifically the two principal conditions stipulated by the Tewkesbury Licensing Committee at the hearing on the 25th July 2017 were simply not adhered to by the organisers.

Firstly the condition relating to *Public Safety* was in respect to the number of persons permitted to attend the event and secondly the condition relating to *Crime and Disorder* and referred to the number of SIA security staff to be present.

The police objections are as follows -

- 1) **Breach of the Licence Conditions** – The number of festival goers in attendance significantly exceeded the maximum permitted mandatory number and thus compromised public safety and increased incidents of crime and disorder. In addition there were only a proportion of the stipulated number security personnel at the event (as dictated by the licensing conditions).
- 2) **Public nuisance** – numerous complaints to both the police and to the Parish Council.
- 3) **Crime and disorder** - complaints and evidence in respect of the violence, disorder, drunkenness and illegal drug use received in relation to this event.
- 4) **Public Safety** – in respect of the new proposed site that this is an unsafe location and relates to the fact that public safety will be compromised by the large number of people walking to and from the event along an unlit road, with no pavements within a 60 mph limit.

Breach of the Licence Conditions –

In 2017 the number of festival goers in attendance exceeded the maximum permitted mandatory number on the licence and thus compromised public safety and increased incidents of crime and disorder.

In respect of the 2017 event the number of festival goers permitted under the licence was 2250 on each day at any one time (with 500 staff and security personnel in addition to this).

The CCTV at the entrance to the event has been very carefully scrutinised by the Constabulary and it was found that –

On Saturday 26th August 2017 at 1900 hrs the number of festival goers on site (excluding staff and security) was **3691**. This was 1441 persons above the permitted on the licence and therefore **64%** more than allowed.

On Sunday 27th August at 2000 hrs the number of festival goers on site was **4038** (excluding staff and security). This figure was 1788 above the number permitted on the licence and **80%** more than allowed.

At 1930 hrs on Sunday 27th August a member of the festival staff who was positioned at the entrance, was 'clicking' patrons into the event and when spoken to by Police Sergeant Claire Morgan the clicking apparatus indicated a number in excess of 3500. In addition she also spoke to the security manager on the night who stated that in his opinion there were in the region of 3000 festival goers on site.

Further evidence that indicates that the organisers were aware of the overcapacity are that there were insufficient wristbands for the patrons and more basically that the event ran out of both water and beer.

The consequence of the excessive numbers was that there was a further breach of conditions in that there were insufficient SIA (Security Industry Approved) and marshals to protect and safeguard the public. There should have been **49** SIA staff for this number of patrons, in actuality there were **21** on site as counted by Charlotte Haslam from the SIA on her visit to the site at 2030 hrs on Saturday 26th September.

In accordance with the condition of a ratio of one SIA staff per 75 customers this means that there should be at least 30 SIA staff on site when the maximum 2250 customers was reached.

One of the SIA was operating on false documents and as a consequence the security firm is currently subject to an investigation from the SIA authority.

It can be surmised that the security provider was fully aware of the shortfall in SIA personnel because they were actually advertising for security staff and stewards during the event!

Despite insufficient security the organisers took no steps to reduce the number of patrons attending; on the contrary, a huge increase in the number of festival goers was permitted showing a complete disregard for public safety.

In addition the police have requested to examine the record of any drug seizures which should have been recorded in the event Security Log Book. This has not been produced which, in view of the reports from members of the public that drugs were seized by SIA staff at the event, suggests a blatant disregard for recognised procedures and implies potential malpractice.

Public Nuisance – in relation to the disturbance and nuisance caused to local residents.

There were 5 complaints received by the Parish Council in regard to overt use of illegal drugs, excessive noise and parking. One of the complaints refer to one of the event **organisers** openly taking drugs and another report states that patrons were blatantly snorting in front of families and children. There were also 7 incidents reported to the police relating to noise and other nuisance, and 4 incidents relating to thefts.

In addition reports from members of the public and police officers state that the final act on the Sunday used profane and obscene language and the noise volume for this performer was excessive and above the prescribed limit.

Crime and disorder - issues in respect of the calls and complaints received in relation to this event.

Police officers who attended the event reported widespread use of illegal drugs and decided that it was more operationally prudent NOT to intervene by way of arrest as this might have only exacerbated matters.

Local residents also complained of illegal drug taking both in the form of complaints to the Parish Council, to the Police and on social media.

There were also a large number of fights and scuffles, particularly during the hours of darkness. One of the Police Officers, APS Handley states *"I dealt with 11 different incidents whilst at the festival site. The majority of these incidents were outbreaks of fighting both on site and in the streets around the site. Nearly all the disorders occurred later on the evening following large consumptions of alcohol"*

Officers report that a woman was hit on the head by a glass whilst watching the final performer on Sunday night.

There was also one police emergency call for assistance whereupon officers from both Cheltenham and Gloucester were sent to assist.

In addition one officer arrested two separate people for drink driving - both had driven from the event and were stopped nearby following bad driving or a road traffic collision.

Social Media

Some of the quotes in respect of the use of illegal drugs and violence from different individuals on the Witcombe Cider Festival Facebook site include –

'A member of our party being threatened when they asked a group to move from our tents seating. Members of our group were approached by people selling drugs'

'We had some idiot throw a bottle of water which hit our table which luckily didn't break in the person's face or hit the baby we had with us, people then seen sniffing coke off their hands at least be discreet about it''

'I was very put off by the amount of idiots fighting and throwing pints over the crowds.'

'It's not acceptable to take drugs openly around children, it has turned into a drug and drink induced festival'

'Loads of drugs going on, we report it to security and all they do was take it off them. People sniffing coke by the toilets'

'I do not pay to go to festivals to get caught up in brawls and to be covered head to toe in cider'

Appendix 9 – Social media comments

Public Safety – The previous site on the A46 was considered by the police to be an unsafe location in respect that public safety had been compromised by the large number of people walking to and from the event. A series of recommendations were made by David Callicott, from the Road Safety department which in the main were not adhered to.

The new proposed location is not on an 'A' road, nonetheless there will be considerable problems and dangers to intoxicated festival goers walking back to Brockworth at midnight but this time they will not be afforded the protection of street lighting and pavements.

Evidence indicates that even with a comprehensive traffic management plan this location is not suitable for the festival.

There are also several reports from police officers of considerable numbers of intoxicated persons leaving the site in the hours of darkness and walking along the road of the A46 causing a danger to themselves and other road users.



Conclusion

The position of the Constabulary is that there is overwhelming evidence to show that the organisers of this event have shown a complete disregard for the processes and licence conditions imposed by Tewkesbury Borough Council. The Witcombe Cider Festival has been promoted as a family festival but in reality it is a focus for drum and bass music, offensive lyrics and as such has become a centre for the widespread use of drugs and the proliferation of drunkenness and disorder. To quote one of the social media reports posted by a festival goer '*it has turned into a drug and drink induced festival*'

Hi Both

I hope you are well.

My apologies for not getting back to you sooner. Its only now, that the festival season is coming to an end, that I've been able to take breath and sit down in front of my computer and answer the mountain of emails...

With respect to the Cider Festival.

The security provider was Simms Group based in Cheltenham. As I understand it, the security provision was upwards of 28 security staff. However, no-one, including yourselves, Simms Group or the Licence Conditions, was able to give a definitive number.

Prior to the event on Thursday 24/08/17, I had a meeting with Simms Group with the hope that they would be able to furnish me with a list of staff that would be deployed over the weekend. They did not have one. I gave them until 5pm on Friday and said that I would collect the list when I attended on the Saturday. They still did not have a list on Saturday. This is due to the fact that they did not know who exactly would be turning up - the security operatives were being drafted in from friends of friends, word of mouth, other security companies.

I completed my checks with PC Tom Evans and in all 22 security staff had been deployed. Of those 22 security operatives, 21 had active SIA licences. One individual was however wearing a laminated fake licence. He was questioned but was unable to provide any further identification to prove who he was. He was therefore cautioned on suspicion of committing an offence under the Private Security Industry Act 2001 (sect 3 engaging in licensable activity without a licence). I conducted a brief interview and suspended it pending further enquiries by the SIA. These enquiries are ongoing.

As the SIA do not have the authority to remove people from a venue or an event, I deferred to Tom and it was decided that the individual would be removed from his position and used as a Steward instead.

Unfortunately I cannot comment on the capacity, this is something you will have to bring up with the Event Organisers / Simms Group.

Going forward for next year; if the event is to take place; I would suggest that the licence conditions are changed to reflect a more structured approach for security provision and the number of security operatives required is a set figure and not the "no less than" style it currently is.

With respect to security provision itself, the number of operatives required to man this event is high (28+). Experience has shown that smaller security companies do not have the capacity to man an event of this size using their own employees. Events are temporary and companies do not want to pull off their staff from regular NTE work to man an event, therefore an ad hoc / scatter gun approach is normally the case and operatives are brought in via Facebook and word of mouth. The knock on effect from this, means that any form of screening and vetting of individuals falls by the wayside, staff lists cannot be compiled in time and you are left unsure as to whether you have the numbers to cover the event and who is going to be working for you.

For events of this size, I would recommend that the Licencing Authority look towards an SIA Approved Contractor (ACS).

Drugs Policy

Witcombe Cider Festival are committed to supporting the health and wellbeing of our attendees by operating our licensed premises safely and responsibly.

Aims of the Policy

- Comply with all legal requirements
- Raise awareness of the dangers and penalties associated with the use of illegal drugs.
- Guarantee the right of all staff, performers and attendees to be in an environment unaffected by illegal drugs.
- Protect Children and Vulnerable Adults from drugs

Possession of Drugs

In accordance with our policy, anyone found to be in possession of drugs will be removed from the event. The drugs will be seized and the police will be alerted. The person in possession will provide personal details that can be passed on to the police. The Police will be contacted and attend site, where there is belief that someone is dealing drugs on the site.

The event log will be completed by the Head of Security.

Detecting if someone is under the influence of Drugs

When people are under the influence of drugs (or alcohol) they can be a risk to themselves and others at the event.

Staff and Security Staff will be briefed on the procedures to follow if someone is deemed to be under the influence of drugs (or excessively intoxicated from alcohol). Signs to look for include:

- Sudden changes in behaviour;
- Confusion;
- Irritability;
- Fluctuations in mood and energy;
- Loss of inhibitions
- Inability to communicate coherently

Where people are deemed to be under the influence of drugs they must be removed from areas of high risk, in particularly bar areas, fairground area or in close proximity to Children and Vulnerable adults. Staff will be trained on how to deal with such cases and each case will require a specific response from the event teams. All staff will remain vigilant in regards to the dealing and taking of illegal drugs. This includes so called 'legal highs' which are now classed as illegal.

Training Initiatives

Our training programme equips all staff to understand their responsibilities under the Licensing Act 2003. Prior to carrying out their role, all relevant staff are trained to identify and deal with guests who may be under the influence of drugs. This training is documented and refresher training is carried out at regular intervals. This will include updates on 'trends' and 'new' drugs being used.

Promoting Sensible Drinking

We are conscious of the potential harmful effects of alcohol and therefore work hard to prevent the misuse of alcohol at our event, through staff training and support for a number of initiatives aimed to combat the misuse of alcohol:

- Where it exists, we support the Pubwatch scheme which works closely with local authorities and the police to achieve a safer drinking environment in all licensed premises.
- In our ongoing commitment to work with the government to improve public health, we have signed up to the Public Health Responsibility Deal.
- We also support Drinkaware in their efforts to raise awareness about the misuse of alcohol and encouraging consumers to make informed choices. We provide a large and growing selection of low alcohol and non-alcoholic drinks, including alcohol free 'mocktails' as an alternative to alcohol based drinks.

Preventing Underage Drinking

In our efforts to prevent young people from gaining access to alcohol, we adopt a Challenge 25 policy across our event. Alcohol is refused to any young person who appears to be under the age of 25 and who does not provide proof of age identification. Only credible proof of age is accepted, this includes a photo driving licence, a passport or proof of age card scheme carrying the PASS logo. Witcombe Cider Festival will also conduct test purchases at our event to ensure compliance.

Responsible Pricing and Promotions

Witcombe Cider Festival recognise that discounted pricing and promotions can encourage excessive drinking. Our promotional activities focus on supporting responsible drinking through competitive pricing set within government guidelines.

We promote sensible and controlled consumption of alcohol by:

- Free drinking water is always available
- Only standard measures are served.
- No single glass contains more than 4 units of alcohol
- No promotion of speed drinking such as 'Happy Hours', 'Buy One, Get One Free' or 'Drinking Games'.
- Alcohol is refused to anyone who appears to be intoxicated.
- Alcohol is refused to anyone under the age of 18 years.
- Avoiding multi-buy promotions
- Not stocking alcoholic drinks that might have increased appeal to people under the age of 18.

Training Initiatives

Our training programme equips all staff to understand their responsibilities under the Licensing Act 2003. Prior to carrying out their role, all relevant staff are trained to identify and deal with guests who should be refused alcohol. This training is documented and refresher training is carried out at regular intervals.

Re: Complaint Witcombe Cider Festival 2017

I would like to bring the following to your attention regarding the recent cider festival in Brockworth:

On Saturday evening, 26 August 2017 I had reason to contact Joe Pointon at around 5:45pm to say that we had campers on the land at the rear of the Cross Hands Garage which is owned by the Parish Council. He was contacted and did come with me and a security man to speak to them. When we got there, there was two fairly large tents. The occupants, which was a mixture of boys and girls, were there. Some had festival wrists bands and some did not. Some of them did not look any older than about 14 years of age. They had been drinking as there was lots of empty cider cans thrown around the area. Mr. Pointon asked them to leave the field immediately as it was not his land. They were polite and took the tents down, clean the area and took all the rubbish with them.

I only saw 1 security guard outside the house of Tony Robert's. Previous years there were ample security to make sure that the people stay off the road. This lack of security is a major security risk for the safety of the attendees of the festival.

On the licensing permit it states that the Music Noise Levels does not exceed 65dB(A) over a 15-minute period at 1 meter from the façade of any noise sensitive premises. I live in Brockworth on the Shurdington Road, past the Chase Hotel going towards Cheltenham. I have double glazed doors and windows and even my conservatory windows are double glazed. On Sunday night, especially I could hear the music, singing and even the words. My question is, where is the control on the noise and how is it dealt with? Where is the evidence that the noise levels did not exceed the 65dB(A)?

Please see attached 4 letters of complaints that we received so far.

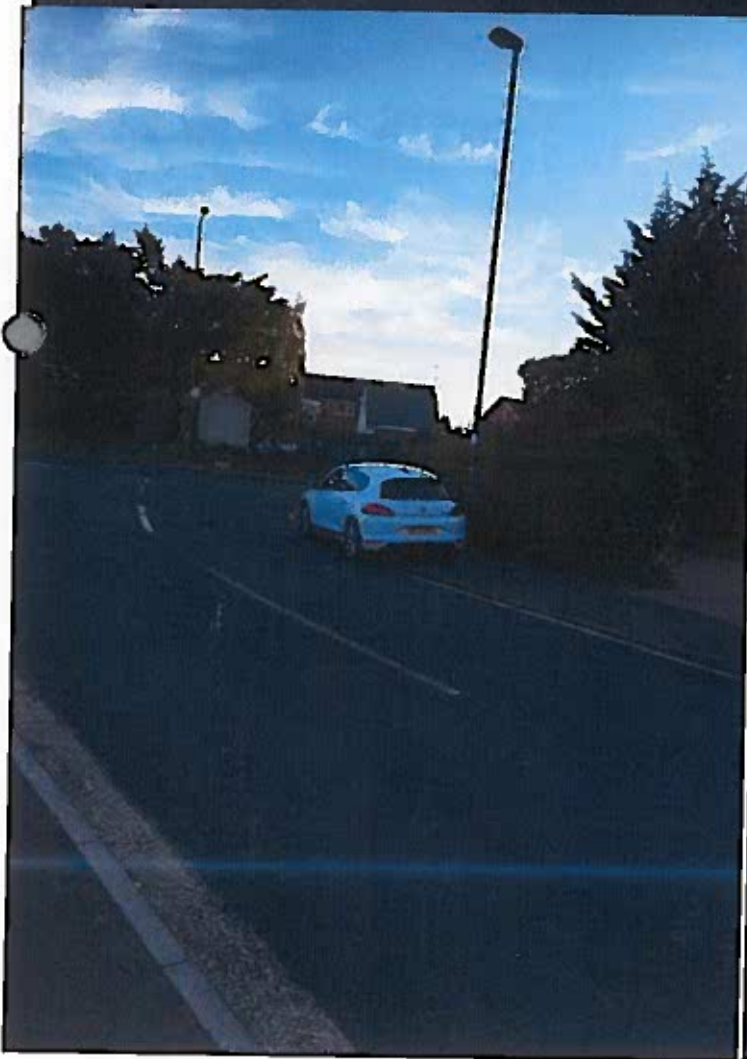

I was directed to attend the location on both Saturday and Sunday evening after 11:00pm, once Tewkesbury night's relief had arrived in Tewkesbury. I arrested two for drink drive, both relating to the event. Both were charged. This is perhaps no surprise when it was so very difficult to remove the crowds from the area as the revellers had to wait for taxi after taxi. It was good to see that some buses had been laid on.

I also intervened in a disturbance between a group of revellers and a large group of security outside the event, whilst everyone was leaving. The reason for the disturbance was unclear

Suffice to say that the revellers were well and truly drunk. It is unclear if anyone was hurt.

I am aware that there were a number of scuffles inside, during the event, which officers "contained," in light of the lack of available resources.

At the time of the event closing, it would have been beneficial to apply a road closure to the A46 from the event entrance/exit to the Crosshands roundabout, in the interests of safety. The drunken revellers were falling into the road and passing traffic.

I submit this report for your information and consideration.

I was directed to attend the Cider Festival on the Sunday evening. My observations were as follows -

- 1) Several complaints/comments about drugs being used fairly openly (cannabis). We smelt cannabis on numerous occasions but with so many people it was hard to pinpoint the culprit/s.
Perhaps in the future a passive drugs going down the line may be beneficial?
- 2) Complaint from one visitor that the DJ was shouting "fuck" & "cunt" over the mic and children were present at the event.
- 3) Complaints that water wasn't as widely available as they thought it should be (apparently the bars ran out of water and people had to use a water container & take their own vessel).
- 4) We prevented a couple of fights.
- 5) We supported stewards who were ejecting people.
- 6) A male who was injured in a fall saw paramedics who said he should drink water however he said the paramedics weren't allowed to carry bottles of water in case it was sold??? He felt paramedics should be allowed bottles of water for first aid type scenarios.
- 7) A girl said she and a cousin or other female relative were down the front of the stage and were being crushed, a male was pulling her back preventing her from reaching the barrier however when she did

manage to get to the barrier stewards were reluctant to help her so she had to virtually climb over the barrier herself.

- 8) The first aid post wasn't where the programme suggested it would be (near the main entrance) & persons looking for it couldn't find it.

I was directed to attend the Cider Festival on both Saturday and Sunday evening.

PS 1760 Robertson and I were both deployed as Evidence Gatherers to document anti-social behaviour and disorder from the patrons leaving the festival site. Unfortunately due to the policing demand at this festival, PS 1760 Robertson and I were not able to gather any video footage as it was not appropriate with the staffing levels and for our own personal safety. EGT's are normally deployed within a PSU serial and work as a pair with one EGT operating the camera and the other EGT being the 'minder' ensuring the safety of the camera operative. To deploy as an EGT in this environment was not appropriate without a supporting PSU, especially as we ended up dealing with 11 incidents during the shift and therefore did not have a chance to begin videoing. Subsequently I produce this briefing report in compensation for the lack of video evidence.

On Saturday (26th) PS 1760 Roberston and I dealt with 11 different incidents whilst at the festival site. PS 1760 Robertson has collated a list of these incidents and will be emailing them to you in the next few days. The majority of these incidents were outbreaks of fighting both on site and in the streets around the site. Nearly all the disorders occurred later on the evening following large consumptions of alcohol. Up until the hours of darkness the festival had a lovely community feel about the event. Families with young

children were enjoying the festival and PS 1760 Robertson and I took on the role of community engagement by posing for selfies and engaging with the crowds. However as the families and children began to leave you were left with a predominantly youthful crowd and when the main act of Wiley began the outbreaks of fighting began.

The easy accessibility of Witcombe is one of the contributory factors to some of its problems. In comparison to Frocester beer festival for example, Witcombe is easily accessible from both the centre of Gloucester and Cheltenham. With regular local public transport from Stagecoach the festival appeals to many people from both these urban areas. Subsequently I was concerned with how many local nominals (criminals) were in attendance at this event. Obviously the festival is available to everyone, and rightly so, but there was a large amount of OCG (Organised Criminal Gang) nominals in attendance and in the wake of recent stabbings in Gloucester park and St Aldate Street I was apprehensive that there would be further disorder. Fortunately this wasn't the case but a policing response and scene management at this event should something like this happen would be a nightmare.

The choice of headline act on the Saturday night is also a contributory factor as to why there were so many OCG nominals in attendance. Wiley is a rapper from East London who is popular amongst young black males. He has been stabbed on three separate occasions and has admitted to selling heroin in interviews. Wiley was always going to attract a problematic crowd and it is no coincidence that when his set began we had outbreaks of disorder in the crowd. One female was hit on the head with what she believed to be a glass that was thrown into the crowd. She received a significant cut to the head and was treated by St Johns ambulance. Also there was a scuffle amongst some black males that was broken up by security.

I also witnessed some clear under-age drinking at the festival. This is almost impossible to stop and I have a lot of sympathy with the organisers who will struggle to stop this. Even if you were to introduce different wristbands for

over and under 18's, I'm sure people with over 18 wristbands will end up buying drinks for those who don't.

I was directed to attend the Cider Festival on both Saturday and Sunday evening.

Saturday was very busy, not what I was expecting. There were 14 incidents that we were involved in. Incident 1 was about 1900 hrs and we were busy until a slightly late conclusion at 0230hrs.

1. Witness intimidation, not related to the event; two involved parties met unexpectedly. No offences, advice given.
2. Report of male assaulting female due to incident of toilet cubical rocking. Differing accounts of incident, all parties calmed/details taken.
3. Female reporting assault, could speak to her as I was dealing with (1), I/P walked off saying she would phone it in.
4. Report of fight about to happen off site at Shell Garage – didn't get to it.
5. On route to (4) disturbance in road, male had assaulted a juvenile. Witnesses stated that it was in retaliation to the juvenile assaulting him. Adult was too upset to investigate fully. Parties separated and moved on.
6. Patrolled area to monitor (5), they met again, more tensions so removed adult from the area to prevent BOP.
7. Report of fight in crowd at main stage. Female hit with full glass thrown by unknown party. Significant laceration taken away by medics. No confirmation if this was a fight or just a randomly thrown glass.

8. Security request assistance with a fight in the crowd. We did not enter crowd, security removed male and ejected. No direct involvement/evidence.
9. As (8)
10. As (8) but D&D at entrance. Didn't get to it.
11. On route to (10). Two groups building to a fight, male and female's, groups separated and monitored. One group left voluntarily. Requested night mobile to assist with D&D.
12. Robbery report. Not a robbery, theft. Female dispute at toilets. Stolen handbag. Handed to Tewkesbury nights to track iPhone. iPhone and bag later found on site!!!
13. Large disorder at Shell garage assistance shout. Only resolved due to assistance from MOP. There were 5 reports of assault. We were unable to determine if they were linked directly. We had it calmed by the time back up attended. Unable to determine culpability so concentrated on keeping the peace.
14. D&I couple taken home by us and night van.
15. Numerous complaints about the amount of drugs being taken, no specific allegations, no action taken.

Feedback from the crowd on Sunday was that there was a great atmosphere on the Saturday and they were unaware of the above incident. However they stated that there was an ugly/tense atmosphere on the Sunday and numerous people felt uncomfortable.

Sunday feedback

1. Drugs complaints as per (15) above.
2. Numerous complaints about lack of available water.
3. We witness people being ejected by security but no assistance was requested and escorted parties appeared co-operative. No information as to the reason for the ejections.
We didn't deal with any incident directly.

I attended the Witcombe Cider festival on the evening of Sunday 27th October 2017.

I spoke to the security manager, Darren SIMMS who stated that there were just under 3000 in there (the licence is 2725 including staff isn't it?) and when I spoke to the front gate staff : the person clicking people in, had almost 3500 on his clicker. When questioned about this he stated that he was told to just click in so that may include some clicked in twice if they left then returned.

It may well have been that they have no idea how many are actually on the site at any one time.

There also appeared to be a very large number of under18's – groups of them (none I saw holding booze though). Though I question how this works unless they bought tickets as I was under the impression Under 18's only got in with a full paying adult. All a bit questionable!

Went to the medical tent and I can only say it's very, very primitive. No staff when I first went there and just 2 medics who we passed as I left. She said they patrol around the place and can be alerted by radio but I wasn't overly impressed.

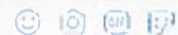

I did attend the festival after there had been reports of several incidents of disorder during the event. This was first put over the radio by T/Sgt 1915 Handley who had been there in an EGT capacity but had to step in to resolves issues.

The Force Control Room put this is as an assistance shout and several officers did attend. On my way to the location, I drove along the A46 and saw many festival goes in and around the petrol station and the bus stop on Ermin Street. As I drove uphill towards the festival entrance, there were numerous personal cars and private hire cars on both sides of this unlit road, I assume waiting to collect persons from the location. There was also a stream of people walking down the footpath towards Brockworth and walking down the road, clearly intoxicated.

With the numbers of pedestrians all leaving the site at the same time, it was obvious that there would be congestion. I did see some security around the main entrance and on the road trying to get persons back onto the pavement. The security I did see was not sufficient or organised enough in my opinion, from what I saw around the site entrance. The security trying to keep persons on the pavements had very little in the way of high visibility clothing on. Barriers preventing festival goes walking onto the road should have been placed down edge of the road (by the kerb) to keep them on the pavement until at least the area lit up with street lighting.

There was a turning area for buses in the site, which was the same entrance that persons on foot had entered and were now leaving the site? Why would you have vehicles and intoxicated persons in the same location, There should have been a

separate entrance/exit for this purpose. I saw security guards trying to clear this entrance of pedestrians when buses were trying to enter the site. There were no provisions for taxi's or private vehicles to park up in a safe well-lit environment.

There were reports of disorder at the Shell Petrol Station, I assume with intoxicated individuals arguing over taxi's that had taken up position at this location.

My observations in respect of the Witcombe Cider Festival are as follows-

Although there were security staff trying to guide people down the road back to the petrol station there were a massive amount of people that were walking across the road in front of traffic, stopping to urinate on people's hedges. People were parking up and stopping to pick up friends and family at horrendous places in the road – in unlit areas, also blocking pavements for the drunk pedestrians.

I dealt with two drink drivers – one on the 26th and one on the 27th – both were just random stops by myself, after witnessing poor driving.

I was also tied up for a while with a drink driver who had crashed his vehicle in to a fence on Moorfield Road – inc 392 26/08/2017.

These were just dealing with the incidents as a response officer, and not specifically in attendance as part of the cider festival protection.

WITCOMBE CIDER FESTIVAL – Post Event Review

I did not attend the event and am dependent on the reports, photographs and video footage that I have been provided with in order to carry out this review.

In the period prior to the event I provided a review of the operating schedule produced by the event organisers. This included a significant number of concerns regarding general and, in particular, road safety.

It would appear from the information sources provided that many of these concerns were not acted upon and the safety of event patrons, staff and road users not attending the event was compromised. However, from what I have been informed, I understand that there were no actual incidents where any person was injured on the highway.

Key issues:

- Patrons on the highway queueing to enter.
 - The footway along the approach and length of the site are at the minimum that would be expected for a lightly used location. For this type of event the footfall is well above that expectation.
 - As patrons arrived prior to the opening time the potential for them to form a queue is inevitable.
 - With patrons attending in 'family' and other groups this leads to overspill onto the carriageway.
 - The 'entry' phase was during daytime hours but would also be when more traffic is using the road so the risks rise.
- Patron egress
 - The two reports and the in-car video clearly show that there was a significant safety concern during the egress phase with patrons paying scant attention to where they were walking.
 - Those leaving showed signs of intoxication and the inhibition and lack of control resulting in a reduced consideration of the risks to their safety.
 - The Fights reported resulted in others being forced into the road to avoid becoming involved.
 - There were few patrons shown on the video whose clothing was light or reflective to assist in their visibility during the hours of darkness
 - The number of vehicle movements past the site would have been fewer than during the daytime hours. This is likely to have provided a false feeling of security for patrons to use the carriageway rather than the footway. This meant that drivers were confronted by groups and individuals in and crossing the road at unexpected places and directions.
Even marked police vehicles appear to have had limited effect on this behaviour.

- The use of pedestrian barriers, while providing a clear division between pedestrians and vehicles would normally be a worthy consideration, with the limited footway width could be less safe.
 - With the volumes of pedestrians leaving there would be the potential for the barriers to be knocked over into the path of vehicles.
 - If done with sufficient pressure pedestrians are likely to also fall into the carriageway.
 - Those who are intoxicated could consider crossing the barriers and be trapped on the carriageway side with no escape route.
 - Barriers would also restrict the movement of security staff, reducing their capability to deal with any issues further along the route.
- Drop-off & Pick-up
 - Although not shown on the video the reports allude to the numbers of private cars, taxis and Private Hire cars that were stopping on the carriageway to drop off and pick up patrons at both ends of the event.
 - While the organisers stated that there would be provision for this within the car park area it was not clear whether this was provided, appropriate signs and lighting was actually provided.
 - Locating such a facility in this position meant that patrons had to walk away from their (potential) direction of travel and that any vehicles attending had to pass the exit point to reach it. This meant that the incentive for use was reduced.
 - The additional result was that those waiting on the footway for a pick up produced an additional obstruction to those walking past.
 - The use of the petrol station at the Cross Keys roundabout as a collection point resulted in numbers of patrons waiting in the vicinity, crossing to reach vehicles with limited consideration for other moving vehicles.
- Vehicle (bus) entry & egress
 - During the exit phase security staff were required to 'manage' pedestrians to allow the service buses to enter & leave the site. This indicates that the shared use of the gateway was unsuitable, as expected.
- Drink drive
 - The operating schedule stated that staff in the car parks would monitor drivers and provide advice to those they considered unfit to drive. As three drivers, having left the event were dealt with for drink driving it would appear that either this 'monitoring' was not implemented, or their ability to evaluate a driver was not as anticipated by the organisers.

- PPE – Security staff
 - The in-car video is limited, due to the period of time after the event closed that it was recorded. However, there appear to be about 3 along the A46; not the number presented in the operating schedule “until such time as the area has been fully cleared of those who have attended”.
 - Those who appeared to be security staff appeared to be wearing dark clothing with minimal retro-reflective material. This level of PPE does not meet the standards of the New Roads and Streetworks Act 2015. The use of this level of PPE was part of my pre-event advice.
As these staff were working alongside & had to step into the road the risk to their safety from passing vehicles was increased.

It appears that scant regard has been paid to the advice provided to the organisers and the potential risks to patrons, staff and other road users has been higher than it should have been. It is fortunate that no injury incidents occurred.
