

I strongly object to Aldi Stores Limited application to extend the hours for the sale of alcohol at their Gloucester Road, Tewkesbury store.

Our property is directly adjacent to Aldi's unloading bay and if you consult with your Planning and Environmental Departments you will see that numerous complaints have been made by us, and other residents of Tewkesbury Park estate about infringements of planning laws and nuisance caused by noise at unsociable hours.

This is a quiet residential estate and we do not wish to have our right to peace disturbed outside of the present opening times.

Aldi's amendment to opening hours and selling liquor from 06.00 to 00.00 hours every day of the week is socially and morally unacceptable in this setting. This is in no way a minor variation to the present opening hours and represents a severe public nuisance for all the residents wishing to enjoy peace in their homes.

Present opening hours are 10.00 to 16.00 hrs on Sunday and 08.00 until 21.00 hrs weekdays.

*** An extension to hours would result in more crime and disorder, public safety and public nuisance**

Also the need for protection of children from harm.

I trust the Licensing Authority will do the right thing in rejecting Aldi Stores application for an extension.

I was shocked to hear of the application by Aldi Stores to extend their opening hours from 6.00am until midnight, including Sundays.

It is totally unacceptable for our lives to be disturbed in this way. This is a residential area where the Aldi loading bay is just 40ft from our bedroom

We have become used to being woken at 7.00am every day (except Sunday, when we are allowed the luxury of a lie in until 9.00am) but to have delivery lorries even earlier in the morning and also late at night would be intolerable.

It is hoped that you will consider the health (physical and mental) and well-being of the residents and reject this application.

I have observed a notice outside Aldi saying the store is "applying for extended opening hours from 6am to midnight each day of the week" and I wish to object to this change.

I believe this will produce added noise and disturbance to those behind the store in Lincoln Close and those nearby on the Gloucester Road. Some of these houses in the vicinity already suffer noise from the early morning deliveries and apart from the excessive opening I would suspect these hours would necessitate additional deliveries to keep the store supplied. I am also concerned that "each day of the week" as the notice states certainly must not include Sundayswhat about Sunday trading laws?.....perhaps this notice is just worded badly.

I do hope the Authority will listen to the concerns of the local residents and refuse the application.
